With 98% of residents living below the federal poverty level and 80% of the community unemployed, life expectancy rates are 38% lower than the national average. GROWL students and the entire Uta Halee staff worked hard to campaign for donations that would help meet the needs of this community. GROWL students organized and hosted a huge bake sale to raise funds; students' families, Uta Halee staff, and community members donated items such as nonperishable food, feminine products, clothing, and infant care items; and students on campus crocheted around the clock creating clothing and blankets to donate.
